## **Introduction :**

A Cooperative is defined as an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common Economic, Social and Cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly owned and democratically controlled Enterprise. Cooperatives are based on the values of self-help, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity. Hence, it is a member-driven and democratically self-managed association of persons united voluntarily for the achievement of common goal that stands for service, joint-action, self-reliance and economic-freedom with accountability and transparency. Cooperative members believe in the ethical values of honesty, openness, social responsibility and caring for others.

It is well said that leading a life in cooperative manner is not a new process, but it is as old as human civilization. The system was formally institutionalized with the establishment of the International Cooperative Alliance (ICA) during 1895. The fathers of the Cooperative as a System gave birth to noble Values and Principles of Cooperatives and applied them for the better understanding and propagation of this noble movement across the globe. The Values of Cooperative viz; Self-help, Self-responsibility, Democracy, Equity, Equality, and Solidarity; and the Principles are the Guidelines by which Cooperatives put their Values into practices in order to reach their noble goals. Each Cooperative is expected to adhere to these Guidelines or Principles of cooperatives in strict sense viz; Voluntary and Open Membership, Democratic Member Control, Member Economic Participation, Autonomy and Independence, Education, Training and Information, Cooperation among Cooperatives, and Concern for Community.

In India, the past history says that during the agrarian movement in the Deccan, the peasants revolted against the money-lenders who were charging excessive rate of interest on the loans taken at the time of their dire needs. The peasants were compelled to take the law into their own hands and confiscated the promissory notes and mortgage-deeds from those money-lenders. These chaotic situations gave birth to Taccavi Legislation by the government leading to the formation of the Cooperative Societies. Then a series of famines broke out in the country from 1875 onwards that compelled the government to form a Famine Commission for finding ways and means in view of mitigating the fury of famine over the country, and improving the economic status of the peasants. The early forms of Cooperatives were the organization of Nidhis and Chit Funds in Southern India. It is also recorded that in 1892 one Civil Servant of the Madras Presidency named Sir Frederick Nicholson was sent to Europe to study the structures of Cooperatives out there. It was he who recommended the formation of the Rural Cooperative Credit Societies adopting the German pattern called Raiffeisen; and then the Government formed a Law Committee in 1901 which formulated a blue-print of the Cooperative Laws. Then the Primary Credit Societies were also formed by the Government of India with the enactment of the Cooperative Credit Societies Act 1904. With the Cooperative Societies Act 1912 the Government formed the non-credit Societies and also Federal Cooperative Organizations in the Country. The Maclagan Committee in 1915 declared that the area of operation of such a Society should be limited and small so that mutual knowledge,

social cohesion and closer connection amongst its members are maintained and these were taken into consideration to be the guiding Principles. The said Committee also recommended that the Membership of a Cooperative Society should be open to all people belonging to different ethnic communities irrespective of their caste and creed.

According to the Government of India Act 1919, the Cooperative Societies turned into a transferred subject and many provinces began to enact their own Cooperative Societies Act. Again, with the Government of India Act, 1935 Cooperatives was made State subject. Further, in 1945 the Cooperative Planning Committee declared that the Village Primary Credit Societies should have the coverage of those activities effecting the daily life and business of the agriculturists, artisans and the like; and thus, functioning as the Multi-purpose Societies (MPCSs). The Committee also recommended the organization of Societies for fruits and vegetable growers, land reclamation, animal husbandry, fisheries, agricultural marketing and processing, small and subsidiary industry, labour, consumers, housing and urban credit etc.

The Reserve Bank of India in 1951, appointed the All India Rural Credit Committee (AIRCC) which submitted its detailed Report in the year 1954 whereby the said Committee recommended wide areas of operation for Village Societies with a view to uplift their economic viability and felt the necessity of reorganizing small Societies by the process of merger. The Committee further recommended government participation in the equity of such Cooperative Societies. Several Committees have examined minutely the working system of Cooperatives in India with a view to make them powerful instruments in the socio-economic up-liftment process.

It has also been suggested by the said Committee that the Cooperative Societies could be made viable and vibrant by:

- **providing financial and managerial assistance by the government;**
- **strengthening infrastructure and development of professional skills;**
- **ensuring democratic management of professional skills;**
- **ensuring open membership.**

### **Constraints faced by Cooperatives**

Against the quantitative growth, the cooperative sector is endangered with various types of constraints in the areas of legislation and policy supports, resource availability, infrastructure-development, institutional inadequacies, lack of awareness among members, erosion of the democratic content in management, excessive bureaucratic and governmental controls and unnecessary political interference in the operations of the Societies in our country.

## MYTHS AND REALITIES

### The Myths:

- ✚ Cooperatives do not work, and are not competitive, thus they cannot flourish, consequently fail.
- ✚ Cooperatives function as agencies of government, thus they are not at all independent/autonomous.
- ✚ Too much democracy is too bad for a business.
- ✚ The Cooperative Values are incompatible with commercial success.
- ✚ Cooperatives are very poorly managed and under-funded.

### The Realities:

- ✚ The Cooperatives provide over 100 million jobs to unemployed people worldwide, thus Cooperatives have been contributing substantially towards solving unemployment problem.
- ✚ Over 120 million people, 2 out of every 5 people are members of 48,000 Cooperatives in United States. In Finland, Norway, Canada and many other countries including India – Cooperatives are doing exceedingly well.
- ✚ Democracy in Cooperative business has proved as an effective dose in boosting up people's sense of Self-reliance, Self-confidence, Self-control, Self-accountability, Self-sufficiency, Faithfulness and Transparency.
- ✚ Cooperatives are democratic socio-economic institutions and hence, the role of Government and Department is simply promotional or catalytic one.
- ✚ Due to high priority given to the promotion of Cooperative Movement based on internationally accepted Principles of Cooperation and promulgation of Cooperative Principles and Theory, Leadership Development and ensuring professional management of Cooperatives, the materialistic and individualistic attitude of people is being subdued gradually.

## **COOPERATIVE MOVEMENT IN SIKKIM**

The Theory and Concept of Indian Cooperative Movement established its roots in the State of Sikkim with the enactment of the Sikkim Cooperative Societies Act 1955. However, with the enactment and extension of new Cooperative Societies Act 1978 followed by enforcement of the Sikkim Cooperative Societies Rules of 1981 witnessed a phenomenal growth of Cooperative Societies in the State. Initially, there were 35 Multi-purpose Cooperative Societies formed for implementing an amalgam of (a) Credit including deposit mobilization, (b) marketing of farm surpluses and distribution of agriculture inputs and (c) distribution / relating to all consumer goods including handling of controlled consumer items. These MPCSSs at the grassroots level is federated to the Sikkim Cooperative Supply and Marketing Federation Ltd. (SIMFED). The SIMFED is intended to undertake distribution of farm inputs, marketing of farm surpluses viz; ginger, cardamom, orange, hill broom, flowers etc. through the MPCSSs organized at the village level. With the launch of National Public Distribution Scheme, a large number of Consumers' Cooperative Societies were organized in the State. These Cooperatives are catering consumer goods requirement of the mass through SIMFED. Consequent to declaration of year 2002 as "The Year of Cooperatives", one MPCSS in every Gram Panchayat Unit have been organized to provide goods and services through cooperatives.

The credit requirements of the cooperatives are being fulfilled with the establishment of Sikkim State Cooperative Bank Ltd. This is first of its kind registered in Sikkim after obtaining the license from Reserve Bank of India to cater to the rural credit requirements especially focusing the cooperatives in Sikkim. As stipulated while obtaining License from RBI Govt. equity share participation of Rs. 9.25 Crores as against Rs. 10.00 Crores by the State Government.

With a view to provide market for milk produced in the Rural areas and to provide fresh and standard quality milk to the consumers in towns, Milk Producers' Cooperative network on Anand Model under the aegis of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) "Sikkim Cooperative Milk Producers' Union Ltd" was set up in the State. The Union has two

processing plants one at Tadong, Gangtok and another at Karfector-Jorethang with total capacity of 40000 LPD.

The North District Milk Producers' Union Ltd. has also been set up at Mangan exclusively for North Sikkim in 2009. So far, the department has registered 38 primary milk producers' cooperative societies in North District.

The Denzong Agriculture Cooperative Society Ltd. is one of the oldest Cooperative Society of Sikkim which has been regular in undertaking the task of supplying of all perishable consumption goods requirement of the Army stationed in Sikkim.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE SETUP**

The Head Quarter of the Department of Cooperation is situated at Sahakari Bhawan, Tadong, Gangtok. The Secretary is the Head of the Department and the Registrar of Cooperative Societies executes the function of supervision, monitoring and regulation of Cooperative Societies. All Districts are headed by Joint Registrar and Deputy Registrar heads the Sub-division offices with host of field functionaries to assist them in day-to-day affairs of the Societies. Audit of Cooperative Societies once in a year is mandatory and it is the statutory function of the Department. To undertake audit of the societies, there are Sr. Audit Offices at District offices and Audit Officers in all Sub-divisions.

Besides the Secretary and the Registrar of Cooperative Societies, there are Additional Registrars and Joint Registrars as scheme in-charges in the head office. The Deputy Registrars, Senior Audit Officers, Assistant Registrars, Audit Officers and Cooperative Inspectors look after the schemes and programmes for promotional works of the cooperatives in the head office. The officers and staff from State Civil Service, Sikkim Ministerial, Executive Service and Accounts Services, Monitoring, Evaluation, Planning and Statistics etc. are also posted in the department to provide backup services for smooth administration of the Department.

## **PRESENT SCENARIO:**

There are 176 Multi-purpose cooperative Societies at the GPU level with over 30000 household members. These MPCs are organized with the policy decision of the Government to have MPCs at every GPU level to cater with consumer and credit needs of the villages. As on date MPCs Share subscription is R 208.00 lakhs of which R 59.83 lakhs as Government's Share towards MPCs. One time financial assistance @ R 77,000/- each have been released to almost all MPCs of which Rs 30,000/- as the Govt. Share Capital Investment in the MPCs. Apart from MPCs, there are about 754 various types of primary Cooperative Societies which includes Milk producer, Consumer, Industrial, Weaver, Marketing, Livestock, Non-agricultural Credit, and transport production and Service oriented cooperatives. etc. Tourism and eco-tourism cooperatives for trekking, river rafting, village/home stay, mountain climbing, sky gliding are also coming up in various areas of the State due to growing tourism industry in the State.

With the initiation of the Govt. policy to execute all construction related works especially at the Gram panchayat and Nagar panchayat level through cooperatives, the Department as on March 2017, has organized 2938 GPU/ward level various types of construction cooperatives formed by educated unemployed youth, women folks, unskilled labour and contractors having enlistment from works department.

As on March 2017, the total number of registered Cooperative Societies has reached 3875 with total 106075 individual share holder members. Government and individual / institutional membership shareholding in the cooperatives is Rs. 2847.07 Lakhs. The annual business turnover is about Rs. 132.66 Crores, Loans and advances of Rs.5471.66 lakhs to the cooperatives and individual members and bank deposits of Rs. 194532.10 lakhs.

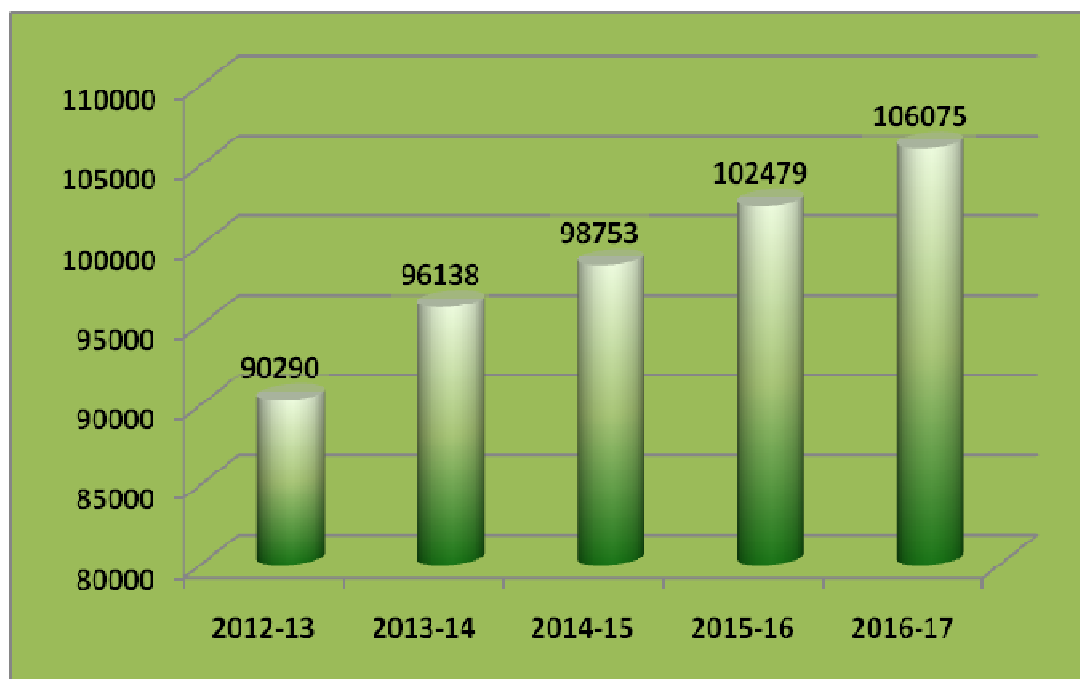

## APEX COOPERATIVE SOCIETIES

### a) Sikkim State Cooperative Bank Ltd.

The Sikkim State Cooperative Bank Ltd, (SISCO Bank) was registered in the year 1996 and came into operation from 1999 under RBI license. It is regulated by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) and the Co-operation Department, Government of Sikkim. It is the first Bank of its kind registered in the State of Sikkim with an objective to raise Deposits and Share Capital for extending loans to its Member-Cooperative Societies and other individuals for viable projects and schemes both in farm and non-farm sectors. SISCO Bank being an apex federated body has unique features i.e. membership of primary cooperatives and also individuals' membership. As of now, there are 286 primary cooperative Societies and 5317 individuals as its members.

### **Initiatives during the period :**

- With the financial assistance of NABARD the bank had organized training and exposure visit in BIRD Lucknow, BIRD Bolpur, IIBM Guwahati and training to staff officers at head office
- The Bank till March 2015 issued 14316 no. of Kisan Credit Cards to the beneficiary farmers
- Since signing the MoU between NABARD, Gangtok in October 2013 for establishment of PACS Development Cell, the cell officially started functioning from November 2014
- The bank has entered into the MoU with the Power Department, Govt. of Sikkim for E-payment of Electricity Bills. The entire process being facilitated by M/s Bill Desk, as a payable service
- The Bank has entered Agreement with National Insurance Company of India for implementation of PMSBY as well as entered into an agreement with LIC for implementation of PMJJBY, given that both the schemes have since been operationalized.
- The Bank is also in advance stage of dialogue with all concerned for implementation of Atal Pension Yojana (APY)
- The Bank has also entered into an agreement with HUDCO for implementing subsidy linked housing loan scheme (CLSS) of Govt of India for the benefit of the poorer section for establishment houses in the notified nine towns in the state of Sikkim and is likely to be implemented from January 2016.
- The Bank has introduced SMS alert services for the valued clientele.
- The Bank has already ordered for some ATM and some Micro ATM given that majority of the activities in this regard has been completed. Incidentally, the Bank has taken a decision for installing 15 ATMs and 75 Micro ATMs within March –June 2016. If the programme succeeds, more ATMs and Micro ATMs would be implemented in the coming years. The board has also taken decision for engaging 75 eligible MPCs as deposit mobilizing Agents of the bank.
- The Bank has taken a policy decision to go for implementation of Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme (DEDS) involving MPCs and Milk Societies.
- The Bank has taken policy decision for computerization of MPCs with the help and guidance of NABARD and the Cooperation Department.
- The Bank is in advanced stage of dialogue for implementing Bank assurance. It is also decided that this task would be entrusted to the MPCs to perform as sub-agent of the Bank
- The bank has set up training centre for imparting various trainings for MPCs functionaries at the head quarter annex building at Tadong.
- The Bank has already entered into the MoU with SUDCO for purveying credit under subsidy linked CLSS scheme of GoI to the eligible beneficiaries from the nine notified towns in the State.

**b) Sikkim State Cooperative Union:**

The Sikkim State Cooperative Union, an apex cooperative federation has been set up exclusively for providing orientation training and education on Cooperatives on regular basis with a view to develop human resource in the Cooperative sector and establishing required professionalism in the management of the Cooperative Institutions. The Union was registered in 2002 under Sikkim Cooperative Societies Act, 1978.

The Union is managed by Board of Directors elected from primary cooperative societies, Chairman/Chair persons of apex cooperative institutions and Government representatives from Finance, Planning and Information and Public Relations Departments. As of now, there are 333 primary cooperative societies including four apex societies as members of the State Cooperative Union.

**The function and objectives of the Union:**

- To impart education to members of the cooperative societies and arrange mass education programmes for speeding up of cooperative movement in the State.
- To act as information bureau on all cooperative matters
- To plan, implement and review education and training activities, to establish and maintain training centers for conducting training classes on prescribed course of instructions and to conduct examination and award certificates.
- To raise fund for administration and other of the Union from the members, State govt. or any other financial institutions.
- To frame rules concerning service conditions including recruitment, appointment and dismissal and termination of services, elections, provident funds and gratuity.
- To propagate Cooperative principles and ideology for healthy growth of cooperative movement in the State.
- To serve as an exponent of cooperative, opinions and render advise to the Registrar of cooperative Societies or State Govt. on all matters effecting the movement.
- To organize exhibition, study visits within and outside the State.
- To publish periodical booklets, pamphlets, leaflets, teaching aid etc.
- To convene conferences, seminars, workshops and other types of meetings at district, sub-division and gram panchayat level.

During the year under report the Union conducted 3 board meetings as required by the Byelaws of the Union and the Sikkim Cooperative Societies Act 1978. Decisions regarding the activities of the Union for the development of the cooperative movement were taken in all the Board Meetings.

The Union has held 8<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting of the Union on 30.03.2015.



During the year the Union enrolled 254 new members. They have also contributed lifetime membership fee to the Union. The following trainings and education programme were conducted by the Union during the period :

## **INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT**

The Union has acquired 4.65 acres of land at Assam Lingzey, East Sikkim to set up its training institute. The DPR prepared in consultation with NCCT and construction of Union's building at an estimated cost of Rs. 22.21 Crores has been approved by the Govt. under SPA. Since completion of the buildings the Union has started conducting various trainings and awareness programmes on cooperative values and principles for promotion of cooperatives movement in the State.

**c) Sikkim State Cooperative Supply and Marketing Federation Ltd.**

Sikkim State Co-operative Supply and Marketing Federation Ltd (SIMFED) was established in the year 1983 as an apex marketing federation of the State for undertaking bulk marketing of agricultural & horticulture produces including important cash crops and distribution of farm-input through cooperatives.

The federation is also supplying uniform, textbook, furniture and office equipments to the Government Departments through its branch outlets at Namchi, Jorethang, Mangan, Gangtok. It undertakes wholesale supply of consumer goods through primary multipurpose cooperatives societies, consumer cooperative societies FOR Siliguri market prices. SIMFED has also started organic fruits and vegetables stall “Sikkim’s Organic” at Kanchenjunga Shopping Complex, Gangtok. The society has also started marketing seasonal cut-flowers viz; Cymbidium orchids, Oriental and Asiatic Lilium, Gentadesia, Gerbera, Roses to Delhi and Kolkata. There are 191 primary cooperative societies including Zilla Panchayat of East, South and West district as member of the Federation.

## **ACHIEVEMENTS OF SIMFED DURING 2014-15**

- During 2014-15, SIMFED marketed local fruits & vegetables worth Rs. 26.09 lakh from its outlets. Organic Turmeric (29,729 kgs) was procured from the growers all over the state.
- At the Siliguri regulated Market, local Ginger worth Rs. 6.25 Lakhs and local mandarin worth Rs. 23.71 Lakhs were marketed by SIMFED.
- Orange growers committee were formed by SIMFED in Hee Gyathang GPU in North Sikkim in order to facilitate better marketing of the local oranges.
- With a view to promote marketing of local organic vegetables and fruits, a new organic vegetable outlet of SIMFED was inaugurated at the Kanchenjunga Shopping complex at Gangtok during the month of October, 2014. This outlet, presently sells only local organic produces of the local growers. When Organic vegetables are received in large quantities, wholesale business of the Organic vegetables is also being done by SIMFED from this outlet.

- In order to further boost the sales of local Organic vegetables and fruits and also to generate awareness and promote the “Organic Mission” among the local populace, SIMFED successfully launched the first of its kind “Mobile vegetable Van” in the state during the month of November, 2014. The Mobile vegetable van was flagged off by the Hon'ble Minister of Horticulture & Cash Crops Development and Food Security & Agriculture Development Department. This mobile vehicle reached the organic vegetables and other organic products to the doorsteps of the consumers.



- In order to ensure consistent supplies of the organic vegetables and other exotic vegetables SIMFED initiated the contract farming with the growers of lower Jaubari, South Sikkim.

- On the consumer business front, SIMFED brought in changes and materials were being purchased directly by our employees based in Siliguri from the whole sale markets. This was done to ensure that the prices were controlled and are very competitive in the rural markets of SIMFED. Apart from the existing consumer outlets, during 2014-15 two new consumer outlets had been opened at Reshi, West Sikkim and at Tathangchen, Gangtok, East Sikkim. The consumer outlet at Reshi will also serve as a collection point for all organic produces.

- Other local produces like cereals were also marketed by the federation. Processed local cereals and pulses were packed in plastic pouches by the Federation under the brand name of “Sikkim Organic”. The same is being marketed through SIMFED’s own retail outlets in the state and at the outlet in New Delhi.
- The total value of the Agriculture Surplus and other produces marketed by SIMFED and other activities related to Agriculture, Horticulture and Floriculture during the financial year 2014-15 was Rs. 325.63 lakh. This was an increase of 28.45% as compared to the financial year 2013-14.
- On the Internal Control System (ICS) work, SIMFED was allotted 3201 hectares of land for the ICS work and outside the state. SIMFED was working on 9830 hectares of land for the Internal control system

### ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2015-16

- ***Distribution of Ginger Seeds under Rainfed Area Development Programme*** : SIMFED in coordination with the Horticulture & Cash Crops Development Department, Government of Sikkim undertook the responsibility of collection of 12.97 MT of Organic Ginger seeds from the local growers and redistributing them again to the progressive growers. According to the scheme, beneficiaries of East, West and South Sikkim were identified by the Horticulture & Cash Crops Development Department, Government of Sikkim and distributed free of cost to growers.

- ***Initiated procurement and sales of local flowers to control market price and support the farmers:*** Apart from the marketing of cymbidium orchids, SIMFED also started procuring local flowers from the growers during the festival period. This was done in order to ensure that the growers received the remunerative prices and that the rates of

the flowers did not inflate for the consumers too. The flowers were sold from the SIMFED's vegetable outlet and other outlets in and around the capital.

- **SIMFED at the time of crisis:** SIMFED has always played a critical role in making the vegetables and other essentials commodities available for the consumers at a reasonable rate at the time of Crisis viz. during highway blockages due to landslides and other natural calamities. The consumers and the local media have been appreciative towards SIMFED for this.
- **Capacity building:** During the financial year Marketing Inspectors of SIMFED were sent to Guwahati for training on Cooperative culture.





- **Marketing of Organic vegetables:** In order to further promote the sale of Organic vegetables and to facilitate the local growers of Organic produces, SIMFED tied up with 10 outlets in and around the capital who were already engaged in the sale of the vegetables and fruits. These outlets were supplied local organic vegetables by SIMFED .

- **Administrative Building at Development Area:**

SIMFED was established during the 1983 and since inception it had been operating its business at rented premises. However, during the year 2017, SIMFED purchased its own office building at Development Area and started its operation from the new premises from February 2017.



**d) Denzong Agricultural Cooperative Society Ltd.**

The Denzong Agriculture Cooperative Society (DACS) Ltd. was registered in 1965 during Chogyal's regime with a view to support producer farmers by creating market outlets to enable them to sell their marketable surplus. It is one of the oldest cooperatives of Sikkim. Initially, the society was formed by the private individuals wherein the majority of the shares were held by the then erstwhile royal family. However, after Sikkim becoming 22<sup>nd</sup> State of Indian Union, the State Government acquired all the shares of private individuals and reinvested to 35 multipurpose cooperative societies in 1992 to give more democratic character to the Society.

The basic objective of the society is to procure all marketable farm surpluses through its member societies by giving remunerative prices to the producer farmers. The society, since its inception has entered into negotiated Annual Contract with Army to supply all perishable consumer goods requirement like meat, fish, fowls, eggs and vegetables to the Army. It is supplied through its supply points located mostly in snow bound border areas scattered throughout the State with utmost satisfaction of Army personnel stationed in Sikkim. There are 77 cooperative societies including 19 Poultry Growers' Cooperative Societies as members of Denzong Agriculture Cooperative Society Ltd.

**Achievements :**

DACS reached the 50<sup>th</sup> year of successful milestone in the year 2015 and celebrated its Golden Jubilee Programme on 28<sup>th</sup> December 2015. The programme was chaired by Shri G.M. Gurung, Hon'ble Minister for Roads and Bridges, Govt. of Sikkim and was attended by the Hon'ble Chairman Denzong Agricultural Cooperative Society Ltd, Shri Puran Gurung, officials from various departments and members of primary cooperative societies. The short documentary on the functioning of DACS was also released by the Chief Guest. To encourage farmers and the staff of DACS, the appreciation letter was also issued by the Chief Guest.

**Improvement of financial position**

DACS has been making standard amount of profit since couple of years by supplying almost 40 to 505 supplies to the Army locally. DACS has never failed to feed its Army Jawans against all odds. Sikkim being prone to natural calamities like landslides and road damage, DACS has not failed to carry on with its supply work. During the major earthquake of September -2011, DACS continued to supply local produce to its extreme points like normal times. Keeping in view the marketing of organic produce, the DACS is playing key role by way of bulk marketing of farm surplus collected from local villagers.

**Long term Sanction from Government of India**

Although DACS has been working with Indian Army for a long period of time, there was a practice of getting sanction for negotiated contract from Ministry of Defence, Government of India every year subject to satisfactory performance. Now, for the first time Government of India has accorded sanction for three years at a time subject to annual negotiation on rate. It's not only an achievement for DAS but an acknowledgement of our hard work and superior performance.

**Unprecedented Marketing of local Broiler :**

The society has been marketing the local poultry broiler since 2009-10 and has boosted the poultry marketing as a part of poultry mission started by the State Government.

- a) The Society grants Rs. 1.00 lakhs annually towards Cooperative Education Fund which is exclusively for Cooperative Human Resource Development, IEC etc.
- b) The Society has been regularly declaring dividend to all shareholders

- c) Three new delivery/supply points have been added during the year 2016-17 viz; Ravongla, 5<sup>th</sup> Mile and Lachung thus endowing employment to various casual labours.
- d) To join hands with the cooperative movement in the state, the society has taken initiatives to bring more members under its umbrella with the total number of shareholders been increased from 64 to 77 during 2016-17.

**e) Sikkim Cooperative Milk Producers' Union Ltd.**

**Sikkim Cooperative Milk Producers' Union Ltd (SCMU)** is an Apex body of the Primary Milk producers' Cooperative Societies formed on Anand Model under the aegis of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB). Its operation is extended to East, West and South districts of Sikkim. North District has its own Apex Milk Union. The main objectives of the Union is to procure raw milk from the Primary Milk Producers' Cooperative societies by giving remunerative prices to the producers who were mostly organized in far flung remote areas of the State. The milk collected is hygienically processed in Dairy plants of SCMU and supplied to markets at Gangtok and Jorethang. Collection, transportation, processing and marketing of good quality hygienic milk and assist the producer farmers to market their products is the primary objective of the Union.

As on date, there are altogether 342 primary milk producers' cooperative societies comprising of both registered as well as unorganized groups as members of the Sikkim Milk Union Ltd.

**History and Development of Sikkim Milk Union Ltd**

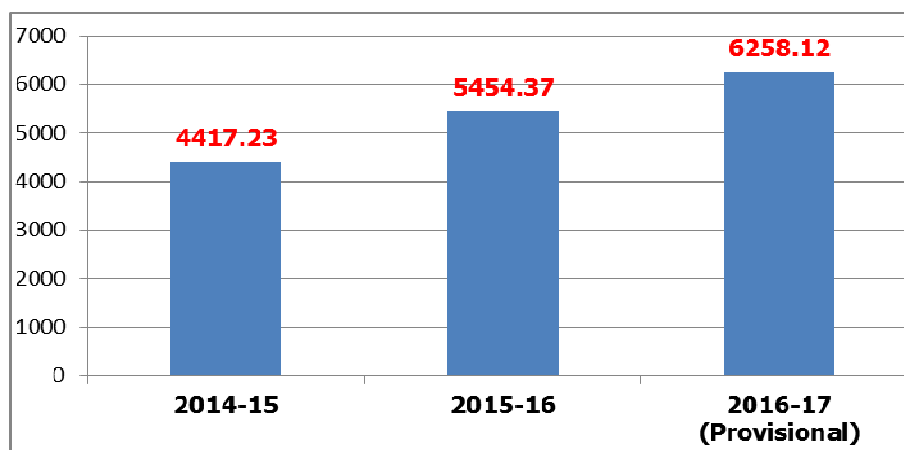
On the merger of Sikkim with the Indian Union in 1975 the then Governor of Sikkim – Shri B.B.Lal initiated the idea of forming a Co-operative Milk Union in Sikkim, probably being encouraged with the success that had been achieved in the State of Gujarat. Therefore, the matter was taken up with Dr. V. Kurien, the then Chairman of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) who also paid a visit to Sikkim in 1977 as a guest of the State. After discussion with the State Government, Dr. Kurien agreed to implement “Anand Pattern” Co-operative societies in Sikkim.

Accordingly, from 1978 the Spear Head Team of NDDB started working in the three districts of the State viz; East, West and South. Prior to this, Sikkim Livestock Development Corporation (SLDC) looked after the dairying business since its existence in 1977. Ultimately, on 1.7.1980, Sikkim Co-operative Milk Producers' Union Limited was formed after being registered under the State Co-operative Societies Act, 1978. Having taken over the project from NDDB, it started functioning at 5<sup>th</sup> Mile, Tadong, Gangtok and at Karfector, Jorethang w.e.f. November 1981, as an apex level (two-tier) Organization of the primary Milk Producers' Co-operative Societies (MPCS) at village level. The Sikkim Milk Union came into being during the Operation Flood –II programme of the NDDB and was established through financial assistance by the erstwhile Indian Dairy Corporation (IDC) and technical guidance of the implementing agency, the NDDB.

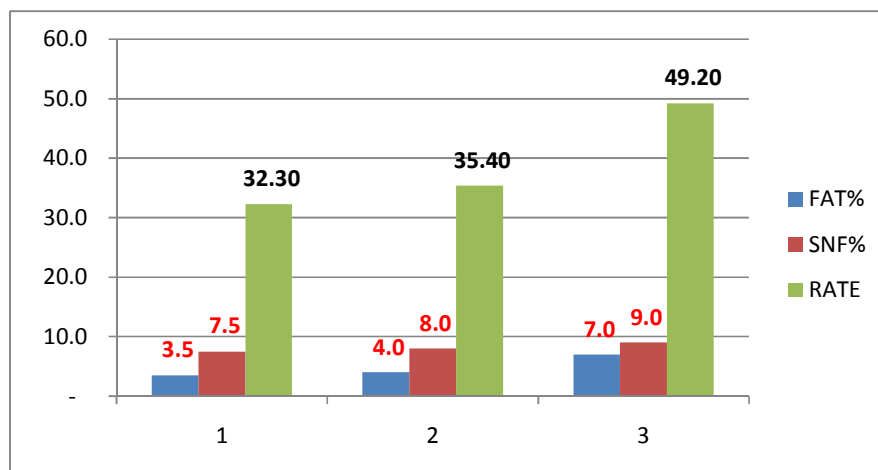

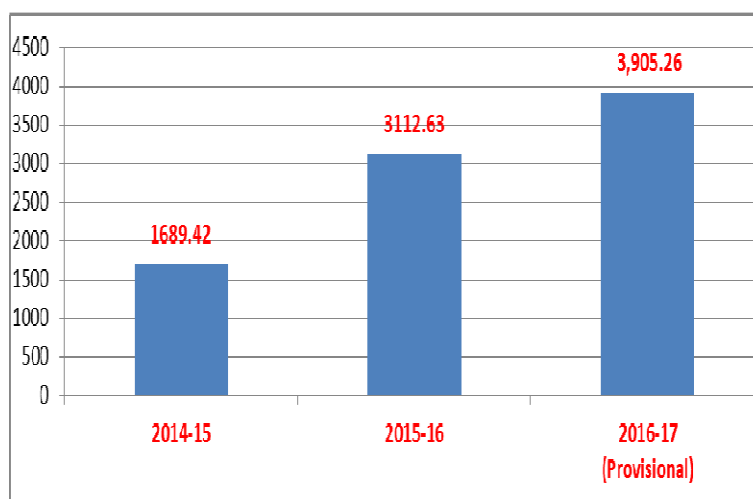

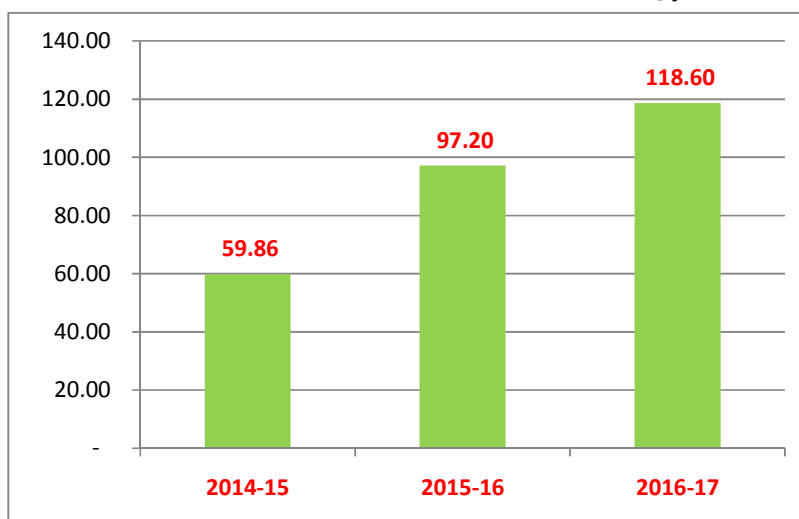
**Payment made to the Milk Societies for the year 2014-15 to 2016-17.**

(Qty. in Lakh Litres)

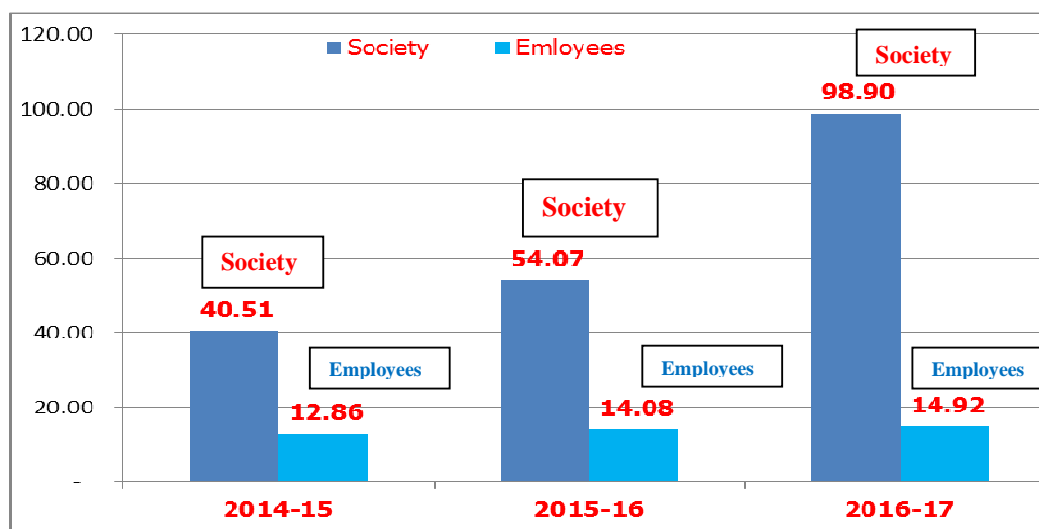

**f) Sikkim Consumers' Cooperative Society Ltd.**

The Sikkim Consumers' Cooperative Society Ltd was registered on 24<sup>th</sup> June 1975 under the Sikkim Cooperative Societies Act of 1955. The society was set up under the centrally sponsored scheme to distribute controlled cloths and other essential commodities at reasonable rate. The area of operation of society extends to the whole of Sikkim.

The society is mainly dealing in stationery and other miscellaneous items use in the offices with the State Government Departments. All procurements of stationery and paper items are made directly from the companies and also through various distributors. Today the society is supply all the office stationery and other misc. items not only supplying to Govt. departments but also to central government departments and limited quantity of stationery to Army located in the State.

**g) The Citizens' Urban Cooperative Bank Ltd.**

The Citizens' Urban Cooperative Bank has been registered under Sikkim Cooperative Act, 1978. It has obtained RBI license for conducting banking business under banking regulation Act. The area of operation of the bank covers the whole of State of Sikkim. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed between Reserve Bank of India and Govt. of Sikkim both the parties exercise a dual control over the functioning of the bank.

Since inception the society has taken initiative to enroll membership as a primary objective of the bank. Comparatively the society has 3074 members in 2012-13 which has become 3273 in 2013-14 and reached to 3716 at the end of 2014-15.

## Formation of Labour /Contract's Const. Cooperatives under Govt. policy

The Government has considered it necessary that the developmental activities in the State has maximum participation of greater number of people from the weaker sections and other cross sections of the society. It is also considered essential that the people of the area where such development works are undertaken should have an opportunity for effective participation in all developmental works. Hence, it was decided by the Govt. to promote the Cooperative Societies formed by Educated Unemployed youths and women, Labour Cooperative Societies and registered contractors in the Gram Panchayat and Municipal ward levels. As of now, there are altogether **2836** various types of Contractors/ Labour including women Cooperative Societies in Sikkim.

To facilitate the above societies, the State Govt. has brought amendments in the Sikkim Cooperative Societies Act, 1978 wherein all registered cooperative societies formed by educated unemployed youth is eligible for award of construction works upto Rs. 2.00 Crores without tender. The cooperative societies formed by Class IV and III Grade contractors are also eligible for award of construction works upto Rs. 2.00 Crores at Gram Panchayat and

Municipal ward for which calling of tender is not required. Similarly, the labour cooperative societies are also eligible for awarding construction works up to Rs. 50.00 lakhs without tender. Provided, the subletting of works by the cooperative societies to third party shall invite penalty in which the registration of the Cooperative Society shall be cancelled. From time to time gazette various notifications were brought out to execute the works awarded to cooperatives by the Government.
