Meeting on Management of COVID-19 at Village level conducted

Gangtok, May 07: A virtual meeting was convened under the Chairmanship of the Minister for Rural Development Department Mr. Sonam Lama on Management of COVID-19 at the Village level, today.

During the meeting, the participants placed their grievances along with suggestions in view of tackling the untoward situation at the village level.

One of the prominent points placed was regarding the free movement of essential commodity vehicles and requirement of setting up of transit points with shelter for drivers. A request for provision of emergency vehicles in the village under the supervision of the Panchayats was also placed in the meeting. Further, it was also suggested that vaccination of employees posted in the Gram Panchayat Units to be considered irrespective of age enabling them to be confident in supporting the Panchayats towards COVID

management. Another issue raised by the Panchayats was regarding RTPCR tests, which if facilitated at places convenient for the village folks, they could avoid travelling long distances and stay away from probable contamination too.

The Minister said that all points raised have been considered and a collective decision shall be taken in consultation with the Chief Minister Mr. Prem Singh Tamang. He directed all Panchayats to generate awareness on COVID-19 protocol and vaccination through miking in the villages, as is being done in town. He also said that the Government has been monitoring the situation in the state and is ready to handle the situation with the cooperation of the Panchayats and Officials at the grassroot level. The Minister expressed his sincere gratitude to the Health Department, Police Department and the front line workers who

He directed all Officers and staff of RDD to be vigilant and work sincerely for the well being and safety of the people.

Pr. Secretary, RDD Mr. C. S. Rao in his remarks suggested all Gram Panchayats to procure a mobile Sim card and activate the village Helpline by using the services of the village/ward level "COVID Monitoring Committee" constituted as per the directive issued earlier.

DC (North) informed the gathering about the current scenario of COVID-19 and the preparedness in handling the pandemic by the District Administration. He informed that 9 beds are available for COVID patients in North District Hospital and incase of rise of COVID cases in the district, Zilla Bhawan Mangan and Transit guest house has been designated as a COVID care centre. There are 60-70 beds available at Zilla Bhawan. DPO (Zilla) has been appointed in charge of Zilla Bhawan COVID care centre while DFO (North) of Transit guest house will be the in charge. Forest guest house will be the care centre for Dzongu area if and when required. All primary health centres has been declared as isolation centre. Phodong Secondary School and Chungthang guest house are the COVID Care Centre for their respective areas

Singhik Secondary School hostel and Mangan Senior Secondary School Auditorium are the quarantine centres. At present, 85 beds for COVID patients are available in the District, he informed.

DC (North) urged all the Government official to be available on their duties in case of any emergency. PHE Department were assigned to provide water supply in the COVID Care and Quarantine centres.

CMO(North) briefed about the COVID19 cases in North District. He further said that there are 2 ICUs and 5 ventilators available in the district.

Pre existing diseases are all covered, maternity benefits up to Rs 50,000/- in normal and caesarean cases, two terms IVF treatment & Emergency and Trauma cases are all covered.

Parents of Government employees can avail benefits under the scheme up-to an age of 100 years. The dependents age limit has been scaled up to 30 years from 25 years and there is no age limit for physically a mentally challenged children and unmarried unemployed dependent daughter. Furthermore, flexibility is provided to make mid- term additions /deletions of dependents on account of marriage, new born, death of member and divorce.

This is a bold and revolutionary initiative by the Government in providing the best health care facilities to its employees. CM launches Sikkim Spring Portal & e-office and SGSP

Gangtok, April 30: Chief Minister Mr. Prem Singh Tamang launched Sikkim the Springs Portal <u>www.sikkim-</u> springs.gov.in and released the Sikkim Springs Atlas, Village Water Security Plan (VWSP) and a book on Dhara Vikas - A Climate Change Initiative in the presence of Minister for Rural Development Department, Mr. Sonam Lama, at Samman Bhawan, today. The programme had the presence of Additional Chief Secretary, Education Department, Mr. G.P. Upadhyaya, Secretaries from line departments, officers from NIC and senior officers from IT Department.

The Rural Development Department has been implementing Climate Change Adaptation Project under National Adaptation Fund for Climate Change (NAFCC) of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) through NABARD who is the National Implementing Agency. This in one of the 23 projects sanctioned by the MoEFCC throughout the country.

The three-year project has been able to address key concerns in water sectors for 76 Gram Panchayat falling under 13 blocks of South and West District. The project was implemented in convergence with Mahatma Gandhi NREGA, and all wage component under the project were funded under the MGNREGA while the material, planning and research component was funded under NAFCC. A detail assessment and planning exercise through Village Water Security Plan (VWSP) has been completed along with mapping of more than 2500 springs. Dhara Vikas work or the Artificial recharge of springs, revival of dried-up lakes and geo-hydrology study to under the ground covering more than 500 hectares has also been taken up under the project. A total of 1380 number of 10,000 litre Individual Household Water storage tank, 109 no of Community Reserve tanks. Total of 2598 hectares of horticulture development and 2500 hectare of fodder plantation have been completed. The Project is in its closing phase with a one year no cost extension granted due to COVID-19 pandemic.

The website was developed by Rural Development Department in coordination with the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (CDAC), Pune, More than 2500 springs of Sikkim have been mapped in the website and Mobile Android application called "Sikkim Dhara Suchana" have also been developed by CDAC Pune for Sikkim which is linked to the portal. All details of the springs, data entry, mapping now can be done remotely using a mobile device through this mobile application and this can be sent to the server/ portal. Also, for 74 drought prone Gram Panchayats falling South and West District, a comprehensive Village Water Security Plans has been prepared. The plan attempts to look at the Climate Change Vulnerability in water sector for the Gram Panchayat, water budgeting

and a strategy to address the same. A details Water Resource Map of each Gram Panchayat Ward has also been prepared and digitized which shows the water distribution pattern from source to the household level, type of water connection (permanent/ temporary), water storage facilities, vulnerable household who do not have access to any of such facilities. These maps have been developed into a Village Atlas for easy reference to address the problem in the near future.

The reviving of the drying up lakes, springs has been the focus area under the project, a total of 500 hectares of Dhara Vikas / artificial recharge work have been taken up under Kaluk, Soreng, Sumbuk, Namthang, Namchi and Gyalshing Block. Hill top dried up lakes are being revived through these initiatives.

Chief Minister during the launching programme stressed on the need to take up more water conservation work in the rural area. Ensuring rural water security is the most important mandate that Rural Development must pursue. He also lauded the department for initiating work in the Climate Change area and further directed that this should be just the beginning and work should be carried out consistently.

The portal has a unique feature of Single Sign On (SSO) which allows the user to avail any e-services offered by the Government of Sikkim with a single login credential. At present, there are e-services which are implemented by the various departments for the user to access those e-services they require to register in all the portals which in turn generates separate login credentials for the individual user. Subsequently, the user has to remember the credentials for all the e-service portal. With the SSO technology, the user has to register only once and access any eservices of the Government. It also allows the user to track all the applications submitted to the various department from a single portal. At present, 13 e-services are being offered through this portal and efforts are being made to integrate the e-district services.

The Chief Minister in his address congratulated the Department of IT for accomplishing the two important projects aimed at enhancing transparency and accountability in the administration. He stressed on the importance of IT in present times and urged the Department to continue with the same zeal. He said that the Government is in the process of extending IT enabled services to the Sub Divisions through better connectivity. While pointing out the problem of files missing from various Departments, he stated that the practice of handto-hand movement of files should stop immediately, and added that proper official procedure should be followed. The Chief Minister urged the Officials of IT Department to gear up for the "Government at the Doorstep" programme envisaged by the Government.

Earlier, Officials of the IT Department and East District Collectorate were felicitated by the Chief Minister as an acknowledgment for their exemplary work towards the implementation of e-Office Project in the State.

Gangtok, April 29: Chief Minister Mr. Prem Singh Tamang formally launched the Su-Swastha Yojana under Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Sikkim, at a function held at Manan Kendra, today.
